---

**SESE:** This week we are looking at mixing a solid with a liquid.

Experiment - Is mixing a solid with warm water the same as mixing a solid with cold water?

You will need: 5 cups of cold water and 5 cups of warm water. **Please ask an adult to help you prepare the warm water not hot or boiling** teaspoons, 5 different solids like flour, sugar, salt, raisins, gravy granules or dried herbs

Remember to **conduct a fair test**. The amount of water must be equal in each cup. The amount of solid you add to each cup should be equal. The same number of spoon stirs needs to be the same. The temperature of the warm water should be the same for each cup.

Make a prediction of what will happen to each solid.

Procedure: 1. Add 1 level teaspoon of each solid into a cup of cold water. Eg. Flour into one cup, salt into the next cup, sugar into the next and so on.  
2. Mix each with a teaspoon.  
3. Repeat steps 1 + 2 with the cups of warm water.  
4. Watch what happens to your mixtures.

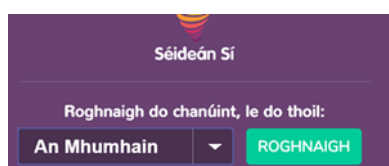
