Baking

Here is a really simple recipe for banana bread. We tried to make it and it was yummy. Have a go at making your own banana bread. You will need an adult to help!

We will post a video on Wednesday morning to help you. If you want to bake something else like Rice-Krispie buns that is ok too. Share a picture of your baking with us on Google Classroom please!

Ingredients:

- 140 grams butter, softened, plus extra for the baking tin
- 140 grams of caster sugar
- 2 large eggs, beaten
- 140 grams self-raising flour
- 1 teaspoon of baking powder
- 2 ripe bananas, mashed

Method:

- 1. Ask an adult to heat the oven to about 180C.
- 2. Butter a small loaf tin then line the base and sides with baking parchment. (I actually used a disposable tin foil container because I didn't have a loaf tin.)
- 3. Mix 140g softened butter and 140g caster sugar until light and fluffy, then slowly add 2 beaten large eggs with a little of the 140g flour.
- 4. Mix in the remaining flour, 1 tsp baking powder and 2 mashed bananas.
- 5. Pour into the tin and bake for about 30 minutes. Check regularly because it is very easy to burn banana bread as I found out. You can test if it is done by sticking a skewer in and seeing if it comes out clean. If your cake needs longer then keep it in the oven until it is cooked.

- 6. Cool in the tin for 10 minutes, then remove to a wire rack.
- 7. Take a picture of you banana bread and share it with us on Google classroom.
- 8. Enjoy your banana bread.
