Maths:

- Master Your Maths -> 1 section per day
- **Fractions 2 (pg. 93-94)**
Finding the whole number from the fraction (rule: divide by the top, multiply by the bottom: e.g.: $\frac{3}{4}$ of the whole number is 18 -> $18 \div 3 = 6$; $6 \times 4 = 24$)

English:

- Modern Handwriting -> 1 page per day
- Reading – 15 mins daily & book report when finished the book to share with the class
- Listen to David Walliams' Elevenes (found at: <https://www.worldofdavidwalliams.com/elevenses/>) and write a diary entry (1 page) as the main character. David Walliams is posting an audiobook each day for free at the web address provided.

- Lch. 132 (C) – (Críochnaigh na habairtí – finish the sentences)
- Lch. 132 (D) – (go minic – often; anois is arís – now and again)(Weather in Ireland – use dictionary for unknown words. Write the correct descriptions under 'go minic' or 'anois is arís')

Project Work: Art

What you will need:

- Plate
- Water

 - a. What happens when you stick your finger into the water?
4. Now, put a little bit of washing up liquid on the tip of your finger.
5. Dip your finger into the middle of the plate.
 - a. Now what happened?
 - b. How is it different to earlier?
 - c. What can this experiment tell us about the importance of keeping our hands clean?
